## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Edgbaston

Before the 1997 Labour general election victory, no Labour candidate had ever won here. The constituency had been in Conservative hands since 1885. Gisela Stuart's victory for Labour continued the constituency's record for the longest run of women serving as MPs, the first being Dame Edith Pitt in 1953.

At the election, Bartley Green and Harborne wards will now fall entirely within this seat, having formerly been shared with Birmingham Northfield and Ladywood. The gain of the Harborne ward stretches the old constituency boundaries to the north, and Bartley Green gains from Birmingham Northfield add a chunk in the south.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Erdington

This constituency was formed from Birmingham Aston and Sutton Coldfield in 1974 and has been Labour's ever since. Robin Corbett inherited the seat from Julius Silverman in 1983 with a majority of 231 votes, rising to 12,657 votes in 1997. Sion Simon, Corbett's replacement, won the seat in 2001.

At the election, boundary changes will see Erdington and Tyburn both brought fully within this seat, along with Kingstanding, giving the constituency marginally extended northern borders.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Hall Green

Created in 1950, Birmingham Hall Green was under Conservative control for 47 years until the seat was won by Labour's Stephen McCabe in 1997, with the highest swing in Birmingham.

The wards within this seat are much changed from past elections – notably taking in areas from the now defunct Sparkbrook and Small Heath constituency.

### Birmingham Hodge Hill

Labour has won this seat at every general election since 1950 when it was formed from part of Yardley.

At the election, boundary changes see Bordesley Green, spanning the south section of the constituency to the west of Birmingham Yardley, brought fully inside this seat, along with Washwood Heath. Part of Stechford and Yardley North went to Birmingham Yardley.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Ladywood

Neville Chamberlain defeated Oswald Moseley here in the 1920s. Labour has held the seat since 1929 apart from a brief interlude from 1969 to 1970 when the Liberals won at a by-election. Clare Short replaced John Sever in 1983 when he was deselected before the general election.

Nechells and Aston wards were acquired following the 1997 boundary changes when Birmingham's parliamentary seats were reduced by one. Since then many minor changes have taken place to the wards on the boundaries ever since.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Northfield

Up until 1979 the constituency saw a succession of Labour victories, but in that year Jocelyn Cadbury took the seat for the Conservatives on a 10% swing. After a Labour by-election win in 1982 the Conservatives retook the seat in 1983 and held it until 1992 when Labour's Richard Burden won and has held the seat since.

At the election, the boundary changes see the constituency gain parts of Northfield, Weoley and Kings Norton, while lose part of Bourneville.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Perry Barr

Labour's Jeff Rooker won the seat in 1974, and with subsequent boundary changes, built a majority to 18,957 in 1997. He was replaced on his retirement before the 2001 general election by Khalid Mahmood, who was returned in 2005 with a 7,948-vote majority.

At the election, redrawn constituency boundaries see the seat gain parts of Oscott and Lozells and East Handsworth wards, but surrender parts of Aston taking a section out of its bottom right-hand corner and Kingstanding.

## General Election: Constituency profiles

### Birmingham Selly Oak

From its creation in 1955 until October 1974 it was in the hands of Tory MP Harold Gurden. Lynne Jones won the seat for Labour in 1992 with a majority of 2,060 votes, but in 1997, on a 12% swing, she won the largest majority in the seat's history. In the 2005 general election Jones successfully defended her seat again.

At the election this is a substantially overhauled constituency. Only two part-wards that existed in the seat's previous incarnation remain. These are a part of Bournville ward and a part of Selly Oak ward. Completely new additions are the wards of Billesley and Brandwood, swapped for Sparkbrook and Springfield with Birmingham Hall Green.

### Birmingham Yardley

Labour's Estelle Morris beat David Bevan, for the Conservatives, in 1992 by 162 votes, and held the seat until standing down before the 2005 general election, when the seat was won by John Hemming, for the Liberal Democrats, with a majority of 2,672.

At the election boundary reconfiguration, the seat has gained part-wards from Birmingham Sparkbrook and Small Heath (Acocks Green and South Yardley) and Birmingham Hodge Hill (Stechford and Yardley North).

### Sutton Coldfield

Sutton Coldfield has consistently returned a Conservative MP with considerable majorities since its creation in 1945. The seat was home to former cabinet minister Sir Norman Fowler from 1974 until he stood down in 2001, and then passed to Andrew Mitchell.

Boundary changes mean the new seat looks very similar in its make-up.

## Local Elections: Background and Prospects

### Introduction

There are three councillors elected for each of the 40 wards in Birmingham (120 in total). Elections involve a third of the seats (one in each ward) each year and in every fourth year there is no election. Councillors serve for four years so this year those who were elected in 2006 are standing down. Those elected this year will serve a four year term until 2014. There will be no local elections in Birmingham in 2013. At the start of this election the parties have the following seats: Conservative 49, Labour 36, Liberal Democrat 32 and Respect 3.

For a long period before the 1980s, Birmingham changed regularly from Conservative to Labour administrations. A period of over 20 years of Labour control began in 1983. Since 2004 the council has been in no overall control, with the Conservatives and Liberal Democrats forming a partnership, currently with a majority of 42 (21 more than the winning post of 60 seats). The charts below show the number of seats held by each party since 1973 and the share of the vote since 1995.

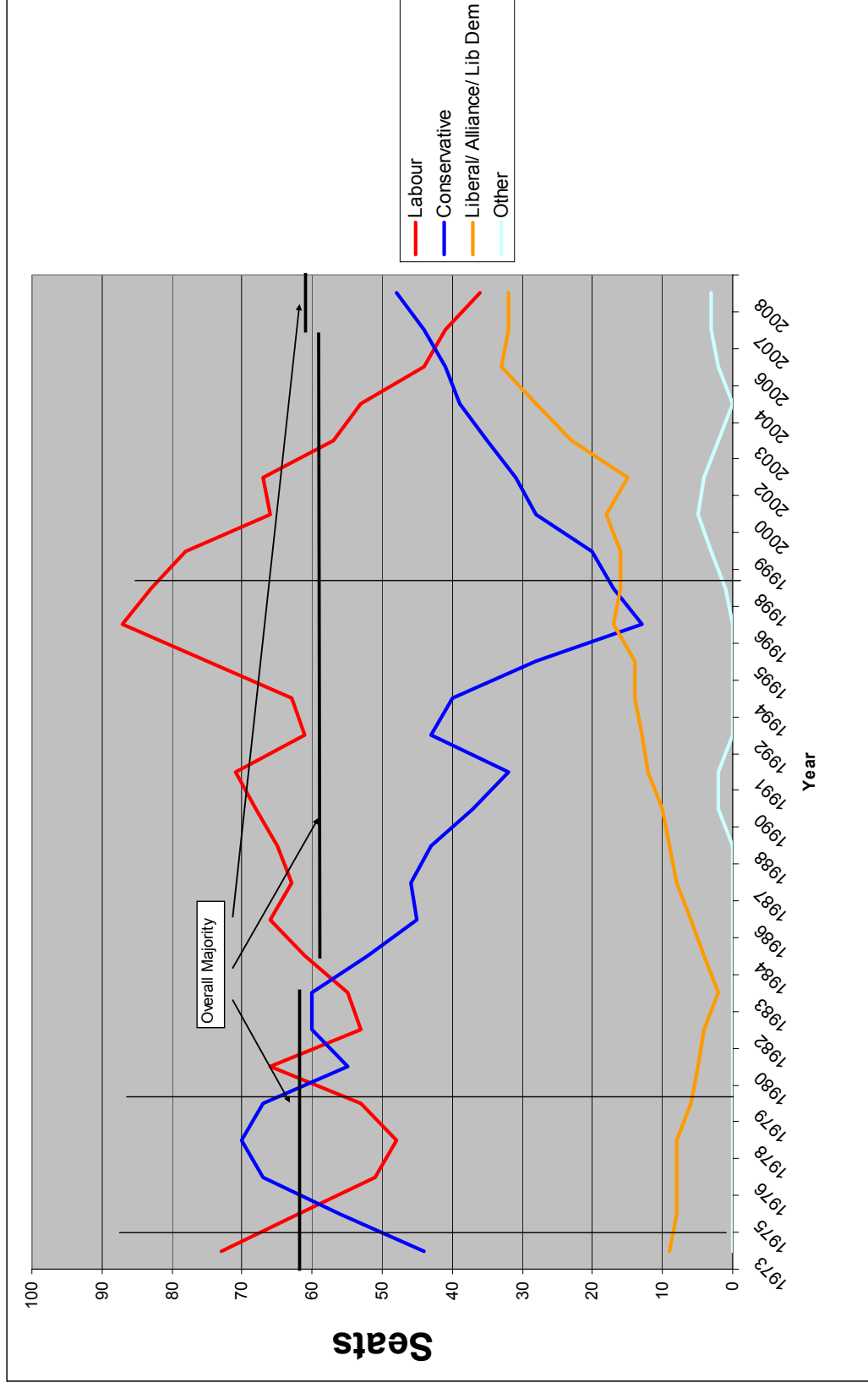
Local election results often tend to follow a pattern based on which party is in government nationally. That party tends to do less well in local elections, but then recover in the election held in the same year or that after a general election. This can be seen in the seats won in Birmingham in 1975-79 and 1979-83. However when a party is in government for a long period this pattern can lead to a longer cycle of results. Since 1983 the position of the Conservative Party did not recover sufficiently to match that of the Labour Party around the 1987 and 1992 elections and fell to a very low level around the 1997 general election. This has meant that, since 1998 the traditional trend has again produced a shift of seats from the party in government to the other main party, but given the very low position of the Conservatives in 1996, this has not yet produced a Conservative majority.

Despite this increase in seats the Conservative Party has not so far gained significantly in terms of share of the Birmingham vote since 1997. The Labour share of the vote has declined by about 13% since 1996 (increasing slightly around the 2001 general election but not the 2005 election), but the Conservative share has remained very similar to their low level of 29% in 1996 – only just going ahead of Labour's in 2008. This suggests that the Conservative vote has become concentrated in their stronger seats, or that they are gaining seats because of a fall in the vote for Labour rather than an increase in their own support.

The Liberal Democrats, on the other hand, made steady increases in their share of the vote after 1996, with a large jump in 2003, when they came second on this measure - increasing overall by 10% since 1996 and by 7% in 2003 (the year of the Iraq invasion). However since then their share fell back in 2006 and 2007.

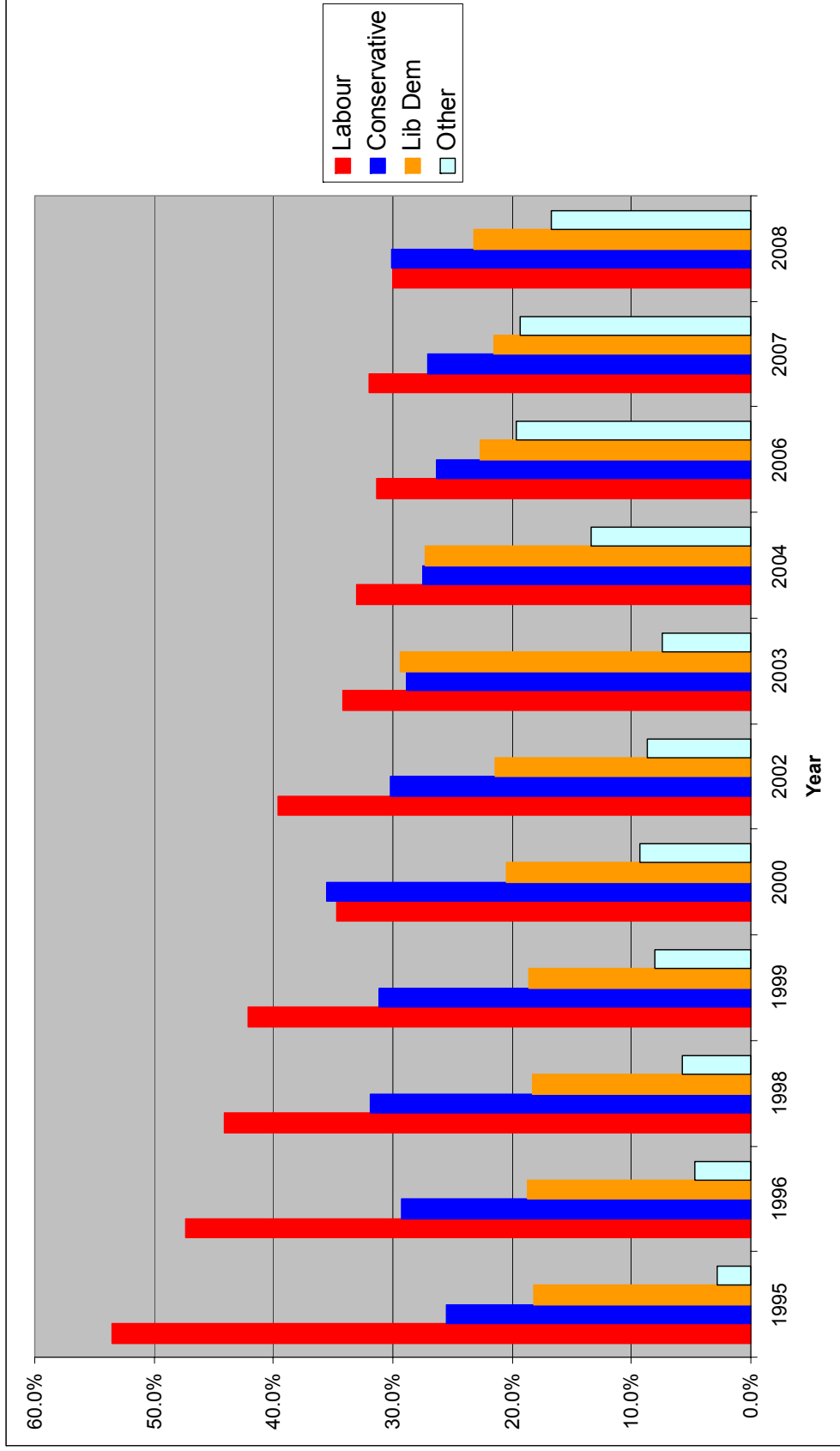
The share of vote captured by other parties has increased strongly since 2004, with the BNP taking about 11% of the vote in 2006 but then falling back in 2007 and 2008.

As this briefing is written, the national polls show an average swing of about 3% from Labour to the Conservatives since May 2006, with Labour support falling by about 5% and Conservatives rising by 1%. The Liberal Democrats were polling about 21% in May 2006 - very similar to their position at the start of this election campaign. However a surge of support has put them 9% ahead of this position. This implies a swing of about 7% from Labour to Liberal Democrat and about 4% from Conservative to Liberal Democrat. If this pattern is repeated in Birmingham the parties would have the following share of the vote: Conservative 31%, Labour 25% and Lib Dem 30%.

However there are some very important caveats to this:

- The national polls are currently very volatile as we are in the middle of a closely fought election campaign. These swings could therefore be very different on election day itself. Updated national figures will be available.
- It is important to remember that the national polls and election swings average out different trends in different parts of the country. In each of the last three local elections the swing to the Conservatives was less in Birmingham (less than 1% in 2006, just 0.4% in 2007, rising to 2.9% in 2008) than in London and the South East.
- Specific ward circumstances are also an important factor with very large swings in particular wards quite common because of the relatively small numbers of people voting.
- Finally the turn out for an election held on the same day as the General Election will be significantly higher than normal (probably more than double). So the previous share of vote in local elections is at best a very rough guide to what might happen this year.

### Target Seats

The tables overleaf show the target seats for 2010. The information is presented in terms of swings required from the 2006 position - the year that councillors standing for re-election were elected - rather than just majorities.

The parties will be defending the following seats (i.e. of their total seats given above, these seats are available for other parties to win this year)\*:

In terms of the seats up for election, 2010 will be a harder year for the Conservatives to make progress (since they have less new seats to aim for and are defending more), similar for Labour and easier for the Liberal Democrats than 2008. Furthermore the Conservatives are defending 6 marginal seats (defined here as requiring swings of 5% or less to change hands) and Labour 5 (2 from Conservative

and 3 from Liberal Democrat) but the Liberal Democrats are defending just one. These marginal seats are now all either Labour-Lib Dem or Labour-Conservative battles – there are no seats in which the Conservatives and Liberal Democrats (members of the current governing partnership) are within 5% of each other.

\* At the 2006 election Labour won 14 seats and Conservatives 16. However a by-election in Brandwood in 2007 led to a Labour gain – producing the figure of 15 each.

## **Election Prospects**

In summary the national political trends and the current standing of the parties would suggest that:

- The council will remain in no overall control and the Conservatives should remain the largest group
- The seats won by each party will depend strongly on the way that Birmingham votes in the General Election – though some voters do “split their vote” and vote for one party nationally and another locally. The key factor is how many of their supporters each of the parties can persuade to vote, in comparison to the normal local election turnout
- Several Conservative seats in the South West of the city are vulnerable to a high Labour voting turn out (such as Quinton, Longbridge and Weoley) but the Conservatives will also be targeting Oscott which they could win from Labour with a very small swing and Brandwood, which they lost to Labour in a by-election in 2007. The national polls would suggest 1-2 Conservative gains.
- The Lib Dems have one very vulnerable seat in Moseley and Kings Heath (Labour target) but will also be targeting three seats they could win from Labour with small swings (Hodge Hill, Springfield and Aston). The national polls would suggest they will be successful.

## **People**

Leader of the Council Mike Whitby (Conservative, Harborne) is the most prominent councillor up for re-election this year. Also standing for re-election are Equalities and Human Resources Cabinet Member Alan Rudge (Conservative, Sutton Vesey) and Planning Committee chair Peter Douglas-Osborn (Conservative, Weoley).

Two candidates are also standing in the general election for constituencies with the same name as their wards – Karen Hamilton for the Lib Dems in Perry Barr and Robert Alden for the Conservatives in Erdington. Salma Yaqoob (Respect) is standing in both local and parliamentary elections in Sparkbrook and Hall Green and Rob Pocock is standing for Labour in Sutton Coldfield constituency and Sutton Vesey ward. The following table lists the prominent councillors standing for re-election and their majorities in 2006.
